Principal's Message

Dear Bulldog Families:

Third quarter has been very busy at Raymond B. Stewart Middle School. The administration and guidance staff held several meetings to introduce new programs that are coming to R.B.S.M.S next year. These programs offer parents greater opportunities to make decisions about the courses their child will be enrolled in for the 2014-2015 school year. Listed below are a few of the innovative programs coming to RBSMS next year:

Infinity Academy: This is a "blended curriculum" that utilizes the Pasco eSchool online curriculum which allows students to progress at their own rate. Students will complete the four core subjects using the Pasco eSchool curriculum, and will complete two electives offered at RBSMS or ZHS. Students will be issued a computer to complete their coursework.

AVID Elective Course- A research-based program for students in grades 6-8 that assists motivated students and provides them with support and tutoring to enable them to succeed in advanced classes. Students attend an in-school academic elective class that prepares them for college. Students will participate in quarterly field trips to local colleges.

<u>CCTE Electives</u>: <u>Agriscience Foundations</u> – This is the first course of the high school agriscience classes. Students will learn agricultural history and the global impact of agriculture; scientific and research concepts; horticulture (plants) and livestock concepts; agriscience safety; principles of leadership (FFA); and agribusiness/marketing, employability, and human relations skills in agriscience. *Eighth grade Students earn high school credit in science for passing grade*.

Introduction to Information Technology - This course is a yearlong course designed to explore introductory and intermediate computer topics using Microsoft Office 2011. Topics include: Keyboarding Skills, Business Writing, Using MS Office 2011 Word, Excel, Power Point. Eighth grade Students earn high school credit in science for passing grade.

As you can see, there are many exciting opportunities for our students during the 2014-2015 school year. I look forward to working with each family throughout the remainder of the school year, and during the coming year to provide a productive and safe learning environment that supports student success.

Second semester is an exciting and very busy time for our music program. In January, four of our outstanding students Amanda Cook, Holly Evenson, Caly Fonseca-Vera, and Ghyslain Velazquez auditioned for and participated in the Pasco All-County Band with other outstanding band students throughout Pasco County. Our Band Program was invited and did perform at a Tampa Bay Lightning Game on January 18th.

In February, our Jazz Ensemble performed in the FBA Jazz Festival and received an overall rating of an Superior. Later that same month, our marching band participated in the Pasco Country Fair Parade and were granted 3rd place for middle school bands. RBSMS MATH TEAMS

Students have been gathering after school each week, learning about Mathematicians, speed skills, teamwork and personal perseverance.

These students have been preparing for our annual District Math Competition. On May 22, 2014, at Saint Leo University, three students from each grade level will compete against students from other Pasco County middle schools.

We have had such a great turn out of students participating in our weekly math team meetings that this year we will hold a Math Bowl here at RBSMS. The Math Bowl will be set up very similar to the district math competition. Students will participate in three events. The first event will be an individual assessment of grade level math skills, the second event will be a team challenge where students will work together to solve multiple step word problems, the third event will be a relay in which each student will have 90 seconds to answer a question and points are awarded to the top five students who finish first with the correct answers. The top three students from each grade level plus an alternate will represent RBSMS at Saint Leo University.

We appreciate all the parents/guardians who have dedicated the time and energy towards their child's participation on the math teams this year.



AVID Program Coming to RBSMS

The Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program is a research-based, structured, college prep system designed to provide direct support for college-bound students who typically find themselves in "the middle." The mission of AVID is to ensure students:

- succeed in rigorous curriculum;
- · complete a college prep path;
- participate in mainstream activities of the school;
- increase their enrollment in four-year colleges; and
- become educated and responsible participants and leaders in a democratic society

What support does an AVID student receive?

AVID students are enrolled in the four required content classes, with at least one of the four being an advanced class. In addition, AVID students will have one elective of choice and the required AVID elective class.

The AVID elective class provides students with support, strategies, and direct instruction to help them complete rigorous work and meet or exceed high standards in each content area. In order to do so, the goal is to assist students:

- develop as readers and writers
- develop deep content knowledge
- know content specific strategies for reading, writing, thinking, and talking
- develop habits, skills, and behaviors to use knowledge and skills
- become aware of the "hidden curriculum" in schools
- develop collaboration
- develop organization

Seventy-five students will be selected to participate in the AVID program for the 2014-2015 school year. If you would like more information about this program, contact Courtney Northcutt, RBSMS Guidance Counselor.

The two performers, Amber Forbes and Joshua Goff, played the roles of Mary McCloud Bethune, Rosa Parks, Madame C.J. Parker, Dr. Charles Drew, and Jackie Robinson.

Mary McCloud Bethune started a college for only women. Rosa Parks, refused to give up her seat on a bus in Alabama. Madame C.J. Parker was the first millionaire entrepreneur who was a hair dresser for black women. Dr. Charles Drew was a scientist who helped perfect the process of blood transfusions. Jackie Robinson was the first African American baseball player to play on a major league baseball team. The students read his autobiography, "The Noble Experiment" in class, before they went on the field trip.

Everyone enjoyed the play and afterwards asked them questions about their acting career and the people they portrayed in the African American Greats play. The performers also seemed to enjoy answering all of there interesting questions. After eating lunch in the lobby and boarding the school, bus the students got to school and the next week took a test on "The Noble Experiment" and used information they learned from the play, about Jackie Robinson to answer some of the questions.
