NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for Raymond B. Stewart Middle School have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the Governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the District School Board of Pasco County Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.

"On-Track" Incentive Program

We are very excited to introduce our incentive program here at RBSMS. We are calling it our "On-Track" program. Students who are "On-Track" will enjoy some special privileges on campus this year. The first of which will be the ability to use their different electronic devices including phones, hand held games and ipods during their commons time before 1* period, during their lunch period, and after dismissed from 7th period. "On-Track" students will also get to line up first for lunch, and then go outside with their classmates when they finish lunch with students who are also "On Track." This is just one of the many ways that RBSMS will be rewarding students for working hard this school year.

So how is a student determined to be "On-Track?" Students are "On-Track" when they meet the following criteria for an entire quarter: have a C or better in all their classes, have no more than 3 absences, and no more than 1 discipline referral. This data is collected each quarter and all students who meet these expectations will receive an "On-Track" lanyard and ID card. Students wearing this lanyard and card will be entitled to any privileges and/or events that are for "On-Track" students only throughout the following quarter. The monitoring of this data began on Monday, August 26th and will go through the end of the 1st quarter to determine eligibility for the "On-Track" program for quarter 2.

Students currently in 7th and 8th grade who attended R.B. Stewart Middle School and were "On-Track" for the fourth quarter during the 2012-2013 school year, were recognized at the beginning of school during a school dance. "On-Track" lanyards were issued and special "Stay Calm...I'm On-Track" t-shirts were presented to these students. We are looking forward to recognizing our students for their achievements at the end of the first quarter. Our goal is for all of our students to be presented with our "On-Track" t-shirt for the 2013-2014 school year!



Coaches' Corner in the classroom

This is a year of change for your student. Your student will be participating in Discovery Education assessments throughout the year instead of Core K12 (for Math and Science) and FAIR (for Reading), which were assessments used in previous years. Discovery Education assessments align with the common core curriculum and cover math, science and reading/language arts.

Discovery Education assessments will provide data for teachers so they know where their students' are doing well and which skills or concepts need continued focus. Please encourage your students to do their best on these assessments throughout the school year. The assessments are on their current year's curriculum, and teachers expect to see growth after each test.

7th Grade Spanish

7th grade Spanish class got off to a great start. Students started off learning how to count to 30, write the date, and tell time in Spanish. Then we moved on to greetings, and introductions. Students wrote interview questions, interviewed each other and asked how are you and where are you from.

7th graders are doing a great job listening and understanding spoken Spanish language tracks from our textbook.
